On mission with God is more than a slogan. It is a way of life for those who take Jesus' commands seriously to go and make disciples throughout all the world. Being on mission means first being a missionary where we live as stated in Acts I:8. Our neighborhood. Our community. Our county. Our Jerusalem. I am all for going other places to do mission, but missions begins at home. (It does not end at home, but begins at home). I think God is presenting Tucker Baptists with

the challenge of doing some much needed mission work right here in Mitchell and Baker Counties this summer. There are housing projects where we can do VBS and outreach to the kids and lonely people everywhere res. There are some community service projects that the lives of people around us. There are potential ministry projects for kids, teenagers and adults from 18 to 100 years of age. On April 19 at 6:30 p.m. there will be an organizational meeting with leaders from our churches at FBC Camilla to discuss ministry needs and volunteers. I hope many of you will come and see what you and your church can do to help us have more impact locally.

During the week of April 23-26 I will be in Pittsburg, Pennsylvania with about twelve other associational missionaries in Georgia who are looking at the possibilities of partnerships. Pittsburg is the largest city in Appalachia. Did you know this? Until a few weeks ago I didn't. In Pittsburg there is one Southern Baptist helps support over 5,200 church for every 42,500 people. In Mitchell County we have one SB church for every 1,150 people. Evangelicals make up only 5% of the population of Pittsburg. Evangelicals are a lot more numerous here than in Pittsburg. Perhaps there is something we can do to help them. I am going to see what is needed and will give you a report when I get back. Please pray that God will help me see what I need to see. Our readiness to

take on a partnership like this will largely depend on our willingness to do more ministry in our own Jerusalem.

I want to commend all the churches who have participated in the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for missions in North America. Did you know this offering folks who serve in a variety of locations throughout America and Canada? If you haven't already given to this offering, I hope you will still do so in the month of April. Easter may be over, but the offering and the needs to reach lost people will not be over until Jesus comes. Don't forget that you will meet some of these missionaries next February in our On Mission Celebration.

ACTION OR JUST TOUGH TALK?

I would like to thank all of you who responded to my article in last month's newsletter insert: "What Is Wrong and What Is Wrong?" It is one thing for me to be bold in writing or even in preaching about things that are unwelcome or depressing to the ears. It is affirming that many of you acknowledge that I am right in what I am saying. Nevertheless, is that all that is needed for a change to come? Merely recognizing the problem is not enough. Knowing the right answer is not enough. Talk is not enough. I reminded our pastors this week that tough critical talk can be like vomiting on people if there is no action to back up what has been said. It might make us feel better for the moment, but it is also plainly hypocritical. We have to take it to the next level: **ACTION**. Thus, I now invite you to **join me in doing something** that I believe can be a **catalyst for the change** we so much need.

No movement of God to bring revival ever comes without God's people praying and praying **desperately** for it. When we pray, WE CHANGE, and our hearts and lives align with the heart of Christ. When we pray, we do a lot of self-examination. If we pray rightly, we come out of the experience with clean hearts that are renewed. As David said in Psalm 51:13, "Then I will teach transgressors your ways and sinners will return to you." That is only possible if we are first clean ourselves (Ps. 51:10). This kind of honest prayer gets us right with the Lord. It must be our reality before we pray for others to experience revival. This is about the only time in life when "ME FIRST" is okay. In fact, it is essential. When we are right with the Lord, it just seems to be a natural thing for lost people to be saved, broken families to be healed, unforgiving people to forgive, passive believers to become engaged, joyless worship to become infused with the Holy Spirit, and dead churches to come alive. The change we so desperately need becomes reality when we're right with God. God lives and thrives among his people once again. Being in church is a taste of heaven. People eagerly await the next time the church doors are open because they know God will be in there. People no longer look for excuses to avoid church. They crush all excuses and eagerly show up. They even show up early. Just gotta be there. Nothing is gonna stop them.

What I'm talking about CAN BE OUR PRESENT REALITY. The concept of a revived church is not something confined to yesteryear. It can be the reality today. We've got to plead for it like we can't live without it. We deny ourselves of anything that stands in the way: tv, internet, entertainment, unhealthy relationships, bad habits, unforgiveness, pride, just to name a few. We even go without food to seek God more intensively. When this happens, God becomes our food. (John 4:32-34).

I am calling on the believers of Tucker Baptist Association churches to come together for a day of prayer and fasting. We will do this on Friday, April 13, from 8 a.m. until 8 p.m. I want to invite you to come and to send people from your church to pray and fast with us. We will pray for each of the 24 churches of our association in that 12 hour prayer time. We will pray for revival in each church. We will pray especially for those churches who are barely hanging on and facing the impending reality of closure unless God's people surrender to him. We will pray for the leaders and all the members of our 24 churches to be responsive to the leadership of the Holy Spirit in all they do instead of relying on man's wisdom which holds them back from glorifying only God. We will pray for a greater awareness of the hindrances to God's work in our lives: cowardice, reliance on "common sense," faithlessness in both big and small things, prayerlessness, laziness, unconcern for the lost, unconcern for the prodigals who have left our churches, coldness to people who are not like us, coldness to God's Spirit, judgmentalism (both pronounced and subtle), racism, lack of seriousness in God's house, insincere worship, theft (Malachi 3), being man-pleasers rather than God pleasers...just to name a few. When God brings these sins to our hearts for examination, I pray that we will repent and be cleansed of all of this. Without intentional self-confrontation, we will always be too busy to deal with these sins and repent of them. Without this intentional self- confrontation, we will avoid embarrassment and pain, but not experience the change we need. All these sins on this list will continue to just seem so "normal" in our churches. We won't see what a big deal they are to God. He is offended by them. We must respond in humility and repentance.

I am inviting you and people from your church to join me in prayer and fasting that day. I would love to have an Aaron and Hur join me for the entire day of prayer. Could some of you come and plan to stay all day with me? Twelve hours! I know this is asking a lot. I also realize that many of you have jobs and church responsibilities. I am sure most of you will not be able to stay all twelve hours. Please come and stay as long as you can. Leave when you need to go. It is okay. There will be designated hours when we will pray for your church. If you can come or send some of your people to the prayer meeting during that designated hour, we will know better how we can pray for you and your church.

One last thing. Fasting is a very personal thing. I believe the Bible teaches that we should fast from time to time in order to more intentionally hear the Lord's voice and to learn to depend on him in a greater way. I am not a judge of your fasting. From reading the Bible, we know it is possible to fast and our hearts still remain far from God. Drawing near to God is what is most important. If you don't feel led of God to fast on this day or you have medical reasons you should not fast, I totally understand that. Some may be able to fast only for one meal. I invite you to do what you can and not worry about what you can't do. Let's do this to draw closer to the Lord and to glorify him. May this be a catalyst for the change that is so much needed in all 24 churches of our association.
