God Bless America or God Be Merciful to America?

As we approach Thanksgiving, we generally attempt to remind ourselves of the need to express thanks to God for all his many blessings to us. We definitely can be thankful to God for His protection, provision and pardon of our sins! I have also noticed, as we approach Thanksgiving, during an election year, we hear constantly this phrase ... "and God Bless America!" I wonder what is really meant by this statement made again and again after a political speech or even a prayer in the church. If we are not careful, this statement could come across as a demand we place upon God. God, you bless America. I would rather believe this phrase is offered as a petition to God. God, would you please bless America?

May I ask you a question? As we approach this Thanksgiving season, do we have the right

standing to ask God to bless America? Now, this question came to my mind, as I thought about a message I was privileged to hear Bro. Kerry Walsh bring a few months back at Pebble City Baptist Church. Bro. Kerry's message was titled, "Can God Bless America?" After hearing his message and contemplating this question for some time, I believe we may be praying a prayer that is not in accord with God's will and a prayer that he cannot rightfully answer at this time in our history. Why do I feel this way you ask?

Well, if you go to Deuteronomy 28, you will read where Moses is telling Israel about the blessings the Lord would bestow upon them for being obedient to His commands and also warns of the curses the Lord would bring upon Israel if they disobeyed His commands. As I said earlier, I believe we keep asking God to bless America; however, we have not been obedient to His commands and therefore we are asking for the impossible. I believe God may be saying to us, "I can't bless you because you are not living in a way that allows me to bless America. I believe we need to come face to face with the reality that the only thing America could expect from God, at this present moment, is the curses due us for our continual disobedience to His commands.

I believe a more fitting prayer for America at this time is not God Bless America but God Be Merciful to America. God be merciful to America is a prayer that would acknowledge to God that we understand we have failed in obedience to his commands and we understand we deserve nothing more than his promised curses upon this nation. God be

merciful to us would be a prayer that acknowledges we fully understand, in our present condition, God cannot bless America. A prayer that pleads for mercy while we seek again his face and turn back in obedience to His commands. A prayer that indicates hearts aware of our standing before God and spurs us on to be obedient to His commands, which bring about His blessings. A prayer that brings us again to the place where God can bless America! So, until we again sense true revival in our land, my prayer will be God be Merciful to America.
