

We Are One in the Bond of Love

There has been a lot of talk lately about the need for unity among churches, associations, pastors and Christians in general.

While contemplating this subject and possible ways to bring about more unity within the Kingdom of God, I thought of the oneness (unity) between the Father, Son and Holy Ghost. I recognized that there is a oneness God desires for husbands and wives, parents and children, and members of the body of Christ. In the beginning, God created a help meet for Adam. Adam revealed Eve "is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of man" (Gen 2:23). The scripture goes on to say, "therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they shall become **one** flesh" Gen 2:24). Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 tells us there

rare benefits to unity among relationships. "Two are better than one (at least as long as the two are one in the bond of love), because they have a good reward for their toil. For if they fall, one will lift up his fellow. But woe to him who is alone when he falls and has not another to lift him up! Again, if two lie together, they keep warm, but how can one keep warm alone? And though a man might prevail against one who is alone, two will withstand him—a threefold cord is not quickly broken." You see, when we strive for unity within our family, our church, our convention and our nation, we can withstand against the evil one, who is constantly seeking whom he may devour. The evil one loves to divide and destroy us.


Prayer Rally on September 1 Jesus' prayer in John reminded those in attendance of 17. Jesus prayed for his disciples, for us and for the whole church throughout the ages. Listen as he prays for unity, "that they all may be **one**; as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be **one** in us: that the world may believe that thou hast sent me" (John 17:21).

Wiersbe says, "he is concerned that His people experience a spiritual unity that is like the oneness of the Father and the Son. Christians may belong to different fellowships, but they all belong to the Lord and to each other. The disciples (like us) had often exhibited a spirit of selfishness, competition, and disunity, and this must have broken the Savior's heart. I wonder how He feels when He sees the condition of the church today?"

So, how do we overcome this propensity for selfishness,

competition and disunity? I believe the key is him with all our heart, mind and soul. We must love our neighbor as ourself. Jesus said a new commandment I give unto you, that ye love one another as I have loved you, that ye also love one another. By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another" (John 13:34-35). Sandi Patty sings a song that says, "Love in any language, straight from the heart pulls us all together, never apart." The songwriter captures it best in this old hymn, "we are **one in the bond of love**; we have joined our spirit with the spirit of God; we are one **bond of love**."




North Georgia Mission Trip
