The Future of Tucker Baptist Association

I am still somewhat tired from two weeks of Camp Tucker as I write this article. However, I was reminded during Camp Tucker that Isaiah 40:29 says, "he gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak." I praise God for all the strength and power he gave to all the staff that helped make Camp Tucker a success this year.

I loved our Camp theme this year! The theme was Project Serve and we spent the week learning about "What is a Servant", "Who do we Serve", "When do we Serve" and "How

do we Serve"! I must confess that this study has been very beneficial to me and I still have some work to do in some areas. I also recognize that learning more about what it truly means to be a Servant of Jesus Christ is something we all need to learn about, not just our children. Being a Servant of Jesus Christ isn't just about performing random acts of service its all about having the "heart" of a Servant, just like Jesus. Jesus said, "...I am among you as one who serves" (Luke 22:27).

So.....

1) What is a Servant?

a) A servant is humble, which means he or she seeks to put the needs of others above their own needs. We move from trying to be in charge or the greatest and simply desire to serve others even it means we come in last place.

b) A servant sacrifices. A servant may have to sacrifice their time, money, social status etc. to serve as Jesus would. Consider the Good Samaritan. He had to sacrifice his time and his money to help the man beaten and left for dead on the side of the road.

c) A servant does something. We can claim to be a servant of Jesus Christ but unless we are helping the hungry, thirsty, those in prison, naked or lonely, we are not truly serving. We are usually people sitting on the sidelines simply talking about how someone else should serve those people.

2) Who do we serve?

Well the short and simple answer is: Everyone! However, as we take a closer look we may see some areas we easily overlook in that general category of everyone. We, like Jesus, should serve

- b) The lost
- c)**Our Enemies**

3) When do we serve?

Again the simply answer is anytime and every time. However, we we need to recognize that means ..

When we see a need. h When we invite others to join the service revolution.
